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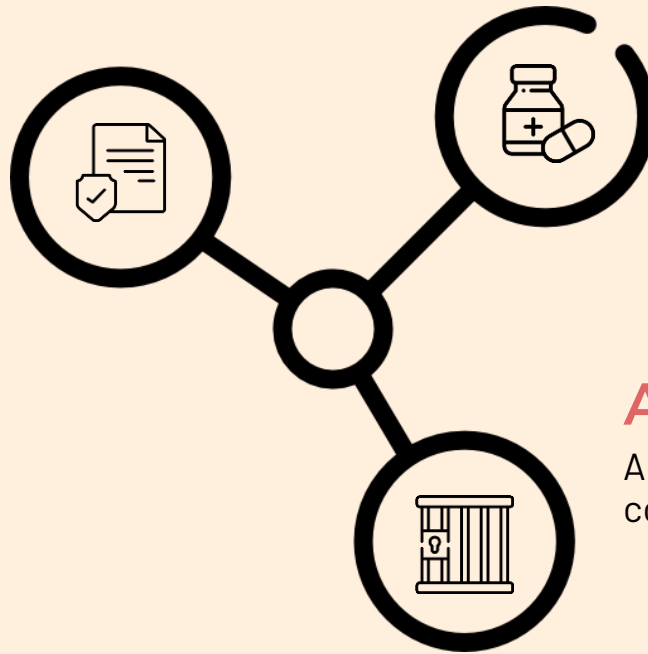

Alarm System, Interior Room, DEA Approved Safe



Program Needs

Counseling, Medical, Equipment, Offices



Workflow

Implement schedules for medicating, services, admission and communication among RTR and AACDF staff and medical contractor



Integration

Manage guard duties, shift changes, transporting patients, work assignments/release, lockdowns, other services impacted



Education

Misconceptions

Debunking myths, and preconceived ideas around methadone



Support

Provide space for questions, concerns, communication with staff



Stigma

Work on reducing stigma related to substance use and treatment

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Road to Recovery ORCC



Medication

2012: Methadone

2023: Methadone, Buprenorphine, Naltrexone

Continuity of Care

Coordinate medication for individuals currently receiving MOUD in the community

Admission

Assess individuals interested in starting on MOUD



Road to Recovery ORCC



Counseling

Individual and group counseling



Medical

Medical assessment and ongoing appointments, random urinalysis testing



Release

Continuity of care planning for connection to treatment post release



Peer Support

Access to peer support specialists on site



Additional

Naloxone at release, access to other AACDOH programs



Continuation of Treatment

1

Notification

At booking, inmate notifies staff they are currently on methadone.

2

Consents

Staff has the inmate sign an ROI for their home clinic and RTR.

3

Coordination

Consents are sent to RTR nursing who coordinates guest dosing and dose verification.

4

Admission

Inmate is automatically placed on the intake list for admission to RTR.



Prospective Patients

1

Request

Inmate submits a request to be screened.

2

Pre-Screen

Inmate is assessed by RTR counselor.

3

Approval

Case is reviewed at treatment review meeting with medical director for approval.

4

Admission

Approved inmate is admitted and begins medicating.



Release Planning

Community Clinic

Planning for the clinic the individual plans on returning to once released.



RTR

RTR Community Clinics will always be able to accept an inmate for dosing.

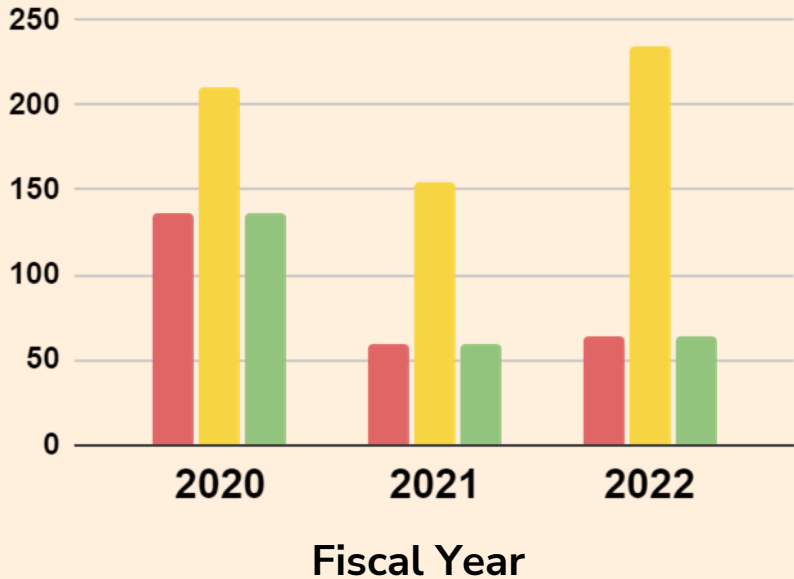


Confirmation

Day after release, RTR staff immediately confirms last dose and sends guest dosing orders.
